

Cost of Energy to the Community August 16, 2006

The meeting was called to order by the committee chairman, Steve Haagenson, at 7:00 A.M. The minutes from the August 2nd meeting were approved.

Steve presented a copy of the "Cook Inlet Energy Supply Study" to the committee. After a quick review of the report the suggestion was made that the committee should make its own list of energy alternatives. The list would then be incorporated into a format for evaluation based on amount of energy possible, prerequisites for success, start up date, investment, monthly bill, uncertainty, environmental, and benefits to Alaskan citizens.

Along with much discussion on each item, the committee came up with the following list: business models, consumer flexibility – conservation, import LNG / FNG/ vertical integration, hydrogen, wind power, coal power production, consumer flexibility – public transportation, geothermal, solar, spur gas line, consumer flexibility – bike paths, hydro-in stream, biomass extraction, biomass combustion, coal gasification, bullet gas line, other Alaska gas, nuclear, enriched gas line, coal bed methane, and hydro-storage.

Steve Haagenson said he would prepare a template with these items for the next meeting.

The meeting was adjourned at 8:15 A.M.
