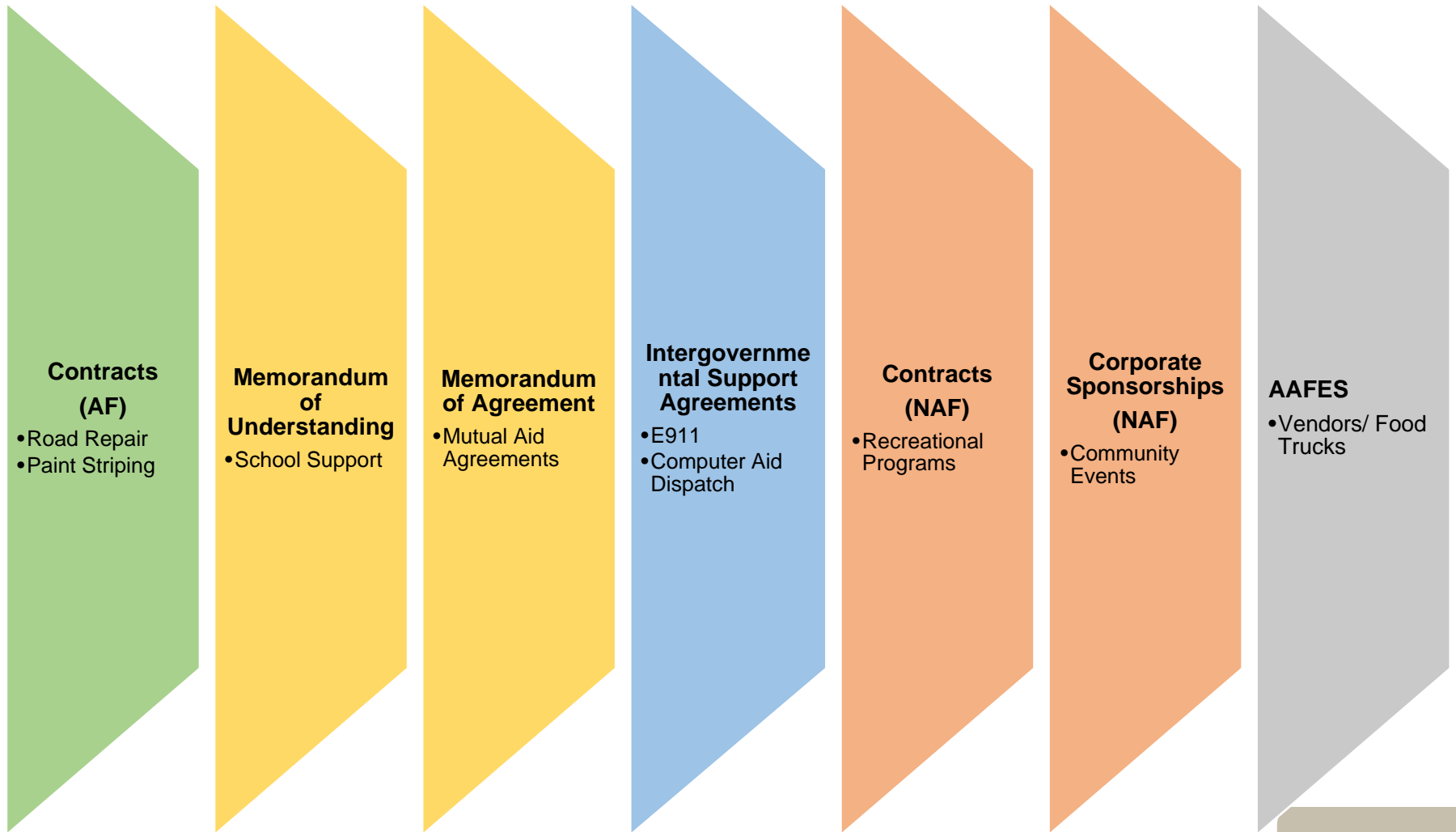

Current Agreements and Partnerships



TYPE	Partnerships
MOA	<p>Health and Human Services – Provides for the Center for Non-Violent Living, Support for adult domestic and sexual violence, domestic violence perpetrators; Alternatives to Violence; Crisis Intervention; Resource Center for Parents and Children; Child abuse cases and Medical Facility Management of sexual/physical Assault/Abuse of Soldiers.</p>
MOA	<p>Education – Entails Literacy Council of Alaska (Citizenship prep and English as a second language); MASST (Adult Learning Programs); Fairbanks North Star Borough School District (pursuit of academic excellence and alternatives to drugs and gangs); University of Fairbanks (Intern Program)</p>
MOA	<p>State of Alaska Department of Natural Resources, Salcha Delta Soil (provides - Layout design, specification, preparation for development and installation of Erosion control or habitat enhancement structures)</p>
MOU	<p>Emergency Operations and Public Safety – Mutual Aid Agreements for Fire and Police (Eielson air Force Base, Fort Greely, City of Fairbanks, City of North Pole, Fairbanks North Star Borough),</p>

TYPE	Partnerships
MOA	NOA and FAA Services – BLM (Remote Automatic Weather Stations maintenance support); FAA (Radar Tower DBRITE support with transmission of radar data from the FAA)
MOU	General Services, Recreation and Transportation – North Haven LLC (Support EFMP requirements); Nordic Ski Club (Recreational Trail improvements - shared biking and ski trails); Fairbanks North Star Borough MACS - Bus – (Bus service connecting Fort Wainwright and Fairbanks); MAC Federal Credit Union – (Banking and Financial Management services to Soldiers and Family members)
MOU	Historical, Cultural and Environmental - Consists of Historical Advisory Council (Ladd Field National Historic Landmarks); Tanana Yukon Historical Society (Register of Historic Places); University of Fairbanks Museum (curation and storage of cultural and paleontological material);

TYPE	Partnerships
MOA	<p>IGSA - <u>Next-Generation 911</u> enables mobile, or cellular, phones to process 911 emergency calls and enable emergency services to locate the geographic position of the caller.</p> <p><u>Computer aided Dispatch</u> provides enhanced data features for increased response times to emergency call-outs, track and update emergency responders enroute, provide real-time GIS data which includes enhanced street map imagery, automatic number identification (ANI), automatic location identification (ALI), wireless tracking ability for a call in progress, failover support of the system.</p>
